The Bachelor of Arts in Liberal and Interdisciplinary Studies is an excellent option for students 1) who want to pursue a degree designed to fit their unique interests and aptitudes in more than one discipline or field, and/or 2) whose goal is to complete a high-quality college degree that values previously earned credits.

LIS majors curate their own degree with faculty guidance, integrating courses and instructional methods that match their interests and goals. Study in LIS empowers students to explore questions that deeply engage them through the methods and approaches of multiple academic fields. The Bachelor's Degree

Grading Policy

Students must earn a grade of C or better in all courses that apply toward the degree. Grades of C- or lower will not be accepted toward the Liberal Studies major. For further information, see the General Requirements.

Advising

All students meet with an academic advisor who specializes in LIS to assist them in registering for courses in alignment with graduation requirements. Students must meet with their advisor each semester before enrolling in courses. A faculty mentor will work with students to develop their plan of study and to discuss career options.

Requirements

Transfer Policy

Students may transfer up to 72 hours of lower-division credit and up to 30 hours of upper-division credit, but the combination of all transfer credit may not exceed 90 hours. The program accepts upper-division credit taken at other accredited universities to be applied toward the degree, as well as alternate credit, including competency test, dual enrollment, military documentation, and life/work experience through IPL 305 Prior Learning.
